





2025 Accomplishments

SIMPCO serves as a catalyst for regional collaboration, supporting local governments across the Tri-State Siouxland region. We work together on long-range planning, community development, and regional program management to promote smart growth, economic vitality, and safe, accessible transportation for all.



INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS

- \$8.2 million in transportation infrastructure projects were awarded with assistance from SIMPCO in the Siouxland area.
- SIMPCO assisted 2 Siouxland communities on water/wastewater improvement projects and assisted with securing \$1 million in grant funds for water/wastewater projects.
- \$781,000 in transportation planning funds were awarded to SIMPCO to assist in maintaining or improving the transportation network in the Siouxland area.



ECONOMIC & WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

- SIMPCO was awarded roughly \$158,500 to support regional economic development planning and services.
- SIMPCO works with state and regional partners to advance broadband, support startups, grow tourism, and improve infrastructure.
- SIMPCO assisted 11 communities/organizations with grant applications, plans and projects.

QUALITY OF LIFE:



- SIMPCO helped Siouxland communities secure \$1.4 million in funding to enhance public spaces and improve quality of life.
- SIMPCO obtained \$138,000 to develop a comprehensive Hazard Mitigation Plan for Woodbury, Plymouth, Cherokee, Ida, and Monona counties.
- SIMPCO secured \$1.3 million to advance bike and pedestrian infrastructure projects.



DIVERSE, AFFORDABLE AND MARKET-RATE HOUSING:

- SIMPCO housing programs expended over \$500k in grant funds for housing rehab projects in 18 Siouxland communities.
- SIMPCO housing programs rehabilitated 23 owner-occupied homes. Including completed projects for elderly and disabled households.
- SIMPCO contracted with 22 local contractors and subcontractors for rehabilitation projects.
